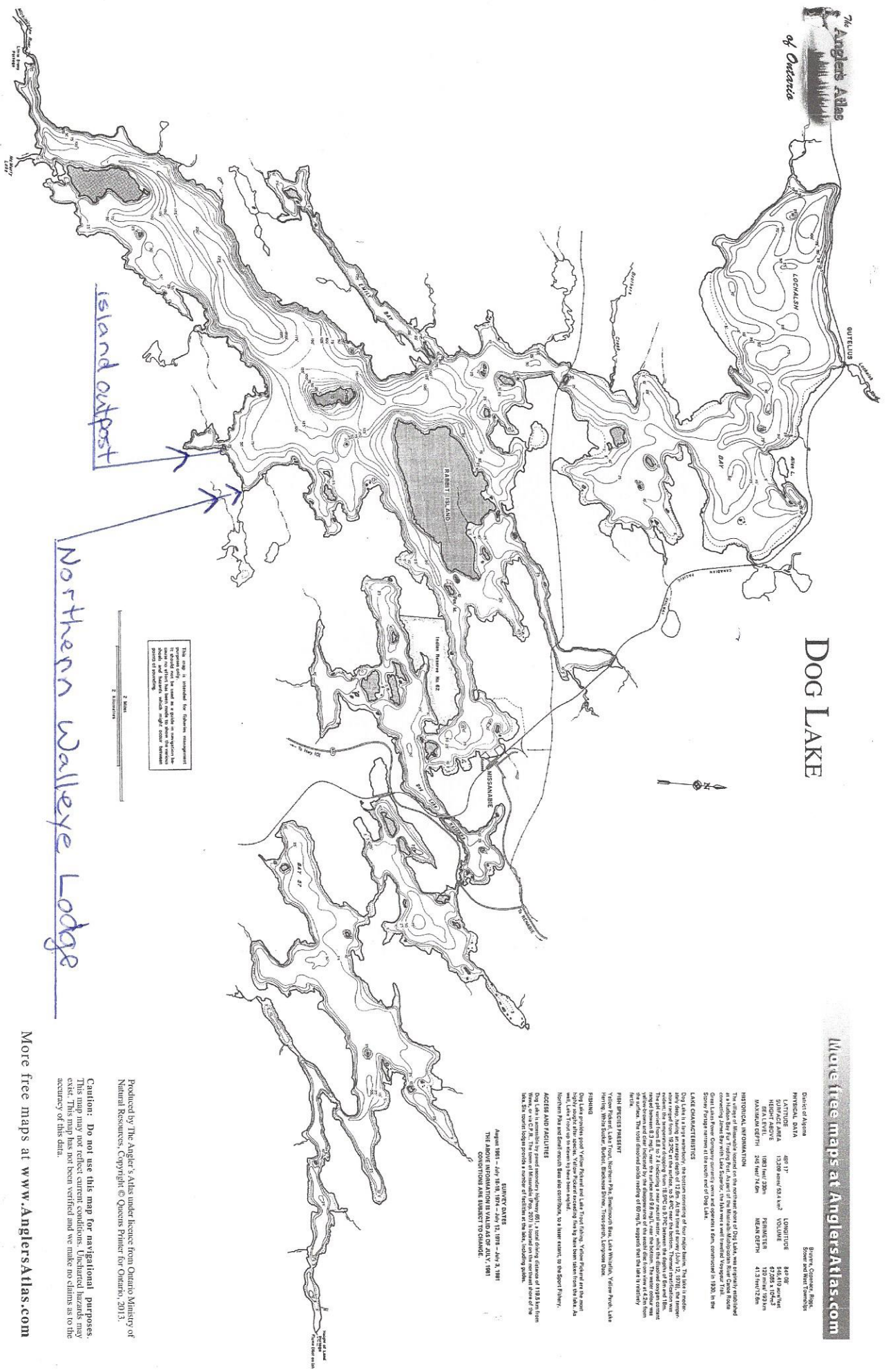

HISTORICAL INFORMATION

The village of Miskanabe located on the western shore of Dog Lake, was first officially established in 1850. It was founded by James H. McMillan, who was a well-travelled Voyageur. The settlement was named after his wife, Miskanabe, the Algonquin name for the lake.

FACT CHARACTERISTICS

The lake is a large, shallow body of water with a maximum depth of 245 meters. The lake is surrounded by a dense forest of deciduous trees. The water is clear and the lake is a popular destination for fishing and boating.

FISHING

Dog Lake provides good fishing opportunities for Yellow Perch and Lake Trout. Yellow Perch are the most common species caught in the lake. The lake is also a good source of Lake Trout. The lake is a popular destination for fishing and boating.
